



Hole in one

Background

Since the introduction of member insurance through the Club's insurance, a member achieving a hole in one may make a claim for re-imbusement of expenses incurred.

However, the Golf Guard policy has conditions attached. Namely: -

1. That the member must have achieved the hole in one in an official qualifying Club competition
2. That the competition is a medal or Stableford format (not pairs, better ball or team event)
3. That the member can only claim for expenses incurred on the day that the hole in one is achieved; and
4. The member may claim cost up to a value of £75

Proposal

Any member achieving a hole in one in an official Club competition, where a claim against the insurance is not available shall receive £25 on their member's card, to assist with post competition celebrations.

Where the member is entitled under the Golf Guard insurance to re-imbusement of cost incurred; all costs shall be claimed; and

The Competition Committee or Organiser shall, within 7 days, arrange for a copy of the competition card, signed by the Competition's Chair (or Section Organiser) to be forwarded to the Secretary.

The member shall obtain a copy of the receipt for drinks on the day of the competition from the Stewardess and forward this to the Secretary with 7 days.

Hole in one ties will be given to members achieving a hole in one on a hole, of full length, in an official club competition (e.g. not from temporary tees or to winter holes).
