



## Junior Section Information

Junior membership is open to any member who is under 18 on the 1st January of the year of joining.

A number of junior competitions will be held during the year and a fee of £3 will be payable to the Professional prior to playing. An entry sheet will be posted on the Junior Board. Any junior member in arrears (unable to play in a competition they have registered for and still owe the fee) will not be eligible to play future competitions until the arrears are paid.

All score cards for competitions must be signed and handed into the Professional on leaving the course and prior to the player leaving the club premises.

All Junior Majors count towards the Junior Order of Merit. Points will be 10 for first, decreasing to one point for tenth.

The club will enter a junior team in the BMW Challenge and the South Manchester Junior League. Further details on the competitions will be posted on the Junior Notice Board. The Junior Organiser will arrange a number of friendly matches against the Men's Section, Senior's Section and where possible other clubs. The Junior Captain and Junior Organiser will select players for the teams.

There will be an individual knockout (full handicap difference) and a pair's knockout (1/2 of the combined difference) played during the year. The finals will be played on Finals day in September.

Any junior under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

Where places are available and for handicap purposes only, junior members with a recognised CONGU handicap may enter the midweek and weekend mixed gender competitions. A junior may put their name on the competition start sheet after 1pm on the day before the competition. Any junior finishing in the top three of any mixed gender competitions will be awarded a voucher for purchase of goods or services from the Professional. Juniors must support Junior Competitions and help encourage younger juniors to play and learn competition golf.

1. Attainment of CONGU handicap
2. Knowledge of basic rules of golf
3. Knowledge of etiquette on and around the golf course and clubhouse
4. Regularly playing with adults or juniors of age 14 or over
